Modeler Granted \$5,000 Scholarship

Leo C Peiffer, from Cedar Rapids, will study at Iowa State under a \$5,000 scholarship granted by the Fisher Body Craftsman's Guild, beginning fall quarter.

To win the scholarship Peiffer modeled a miniature Napoleonic coach in the guild's model-building contest this year. Nine youths were declared grand national winners and will receive university scholarships amounting to \$32,000 which were offered by the Fisher Body Craftsman's guild.

Peiffer graduated from Franklin High School in Cedar Rapids this spring and enrolled at Iowa State before learning of his achievement. He plans to study architectural engineering.

Camp Dodge To Have Full Service Of Books

Library service to be offered at the Camp Dodge annex will be comparable to that offered here in Ames, according to Robert E. Orr, Iowa State librarian.

The number of books to be sent is not yet known, but will depend on the needs of the various instructors, he indicated. Collections will be adequate to support the instructional program, and to supply supplementary reading and recreational needs of faculty and students.

Two Librarians

Although complete and final arrangements have not been made, it is expected that there will be two librarians at the Camp Dodge annex library, with enough student assistants to handle the volume of work. The attendants there, Orr stated, will be in a position to supply reference material as needed. "Books and periodicals placed there will be supplemented by others sent from here as the need arises," he explained. Books will be sent on request in much the same way that they are put on reserve here.

Wide Variety

Orr declined to even estimate the number of books which would be sent, but indicated that they will include a wide variety of material. Some of the classes of reading material mentioned include references, general interest on various sciences, travel and fiction, current magazines on engineering and science and general magazines for recreational reading, such as Reader's Digest, Science News Letter, and Saturday Evening Post.
